REPORTS

You're invited - to an exclusive opportunity to visit the privately owned Yookamurra Wildlife Sanctuary. Not normally open to the public, for one day only, Australian Wildlife Conservancy (AWC) is giving you the chance to step inside the 1,100 hectare free-free area which is home to some of Australia's most threatened wildlife such as the Greater Gillie Numbat, Snowshoe Hopping and Bush-tailed Dog.

Learn how AWC is helping to save Australia's endangered animals while immersing yourself in the Mallee and discovering tracks and traces of ecological mammals who call Yookamurra home.

AWC is the largest private (non-profit) owner and manager of land for conservation in Australia, with an expanding network of sanctuaries and properties protecting endangered wildlife across almost 4 million hectares.

Maths Conundrum Solution

Let's group the numbers in pairs:

0 and 999,999,999

1 and 999,999,998

2 and 999,999,997



For each pair the digits add up to 87, and there are 500,000,000 pairs. The total of the digits are:

$81 \times 500,000,000 = 40,500,000,000$ but we have left out 1,000,000,000 whose digits add up to 1. So the grand total is: 40,500,000,001.

3 times a term Playgroup will be held in conjunction with a Kindy session, where Playgroup and Kindy kids get to learn and play together.



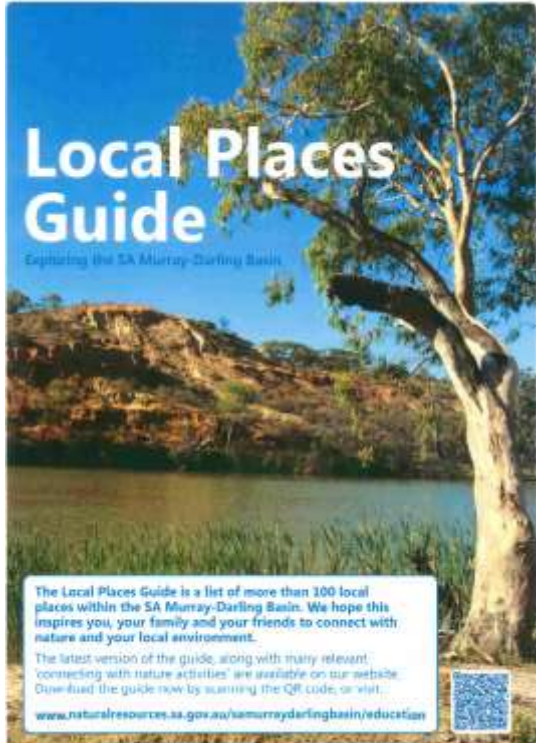
