PRINCIPAL'S REPORT CONTINUED

SCHOOL CAPTAINS

Congratulations to Simone and Anika on their appointment as School Captains for 2016. Staff also appointed Kylesha as proxy captain. They have agreed to adhere to the school values and be role models.

PARENT VISITORS TO SITE

It is important for parents to feel comfortable on site as we work together for our students. However it is important that all are aware of the restrictions of free movement around the school. This does not relate to parents who are simply dropping off or picking up their children at the beginning or end of the school day. Parents who wish/need to visit their child(ren) during the learning day or meet with staff without prior organisation must check in at the Front Office first. DECD site safety policy mandates that we know who is on site, at all times during the day, in case of an emergency.

COMPUTER ALLOCATIONS

SRAS is fortunate to be able to provide 1:1 computer use for each student. Each student will be allocated a computer to use and be responsible for. As part of this scheme they will each sign a computer use agreement; please go through the agreement with your students to help them understand their responsibilities. While this need is becoming more a necessity for 21st Century learning, it is a privilege and not a right. A reminder to all parents and students to keep in mind

BUSHFIRE PROCEDURES ON CATASTROPHIC DAYS

On days where a Catastrophic Fire Danger rating is forecast:

- all school bus routes travelling through any affected Fire Ban District(s) will be cancelled
- School will still be open and lessons will run as normal
- If the Fire Ban rating changes to 'Catastrophic' during the day, school buses will
 operate as normal, unless advised otherwise by authorised Emergency Services
 personnel.

If a bushfire is reported in the area during the day:

- affected bus runs will not to leave the school until the roads are declared safe by emergency services authorities
- Parents will be notified and students will be supervised at school, until buses can run, or until parents are able to collect their children.

A DECD generic brochure for sites in 'low risk' bushfire areas, like SRAS, has been included in this week 1 newsletter. It provides an overview of our response to keep your child(ren) safe if needed.

VOLUNTEERS

Our WeMatter motto for building positive school communities is, 'Every Face Has a Place.' Your time, presence and help is certainly encouraged. There is a new DECD Volunteers Policy that SRAS needs to implement. It makes ongoing volunteer

SRAS staff will meet and identify areas where volunteers will be of most benefit to our students' needs. Once this is done, we'll inform the community and those interested can make a time to meet with the Principal, who is responsible for ALL volunteers within our site.

The 2-5 and 6/7 classes are seeking parents and carers who can assist with swimming practise supervision during school hours, over the next 2 weeks, as we prepare for our swimming carnival. Japan Trip 2018

This year we are organising our exchange trip to Japan. This trip will be held at the end of term 3. I will guide and supervise our students and students from Mannum. I am planning to visit Japan from week 10 of term 3 and be back to Australia by the middle weekend of school holidays in October. The estimated cost of this trip is approximately \$2500 for the return airfares, taxes and accomodation BUT DOES NOT include spending money. This year we will have approximately 12-13 days away. This will include staying with a Japanese host family, which could be the family of a student you host in Australia if you choose to do so. We will also be visiting Hineno High School, Universal Studios Japan and a short trip to Hiroshima, famous as the first nuclear bombed city and one of the world heritage sites.

If you are interested in the possibility of a return trip, please complete the attached registration of interest and return to me via the front office by Friday Week 5 Term 1(2/03/2018). This is not a binding contract! I will be having an information session on Thursday week 2 (8/2 at 5:30 in the Japanese room)

The students eligible for this trip will be in Year 7 and above. Holding this trip is subject to the number of participating students (we need at least 5 students), so it is a good idea to talk to your family to see if it is possible. This is a great opportunity for our students to experience a different culture with complete support from staff your child(ren) know.




